CIRCULAR LETTER NO. 2333

**DATA REPORTING
WORKERS' COMPENSATION TERRORISM DATA FOR FEDERAL
INSURANCE OFFICE - Section 111 of TRIPRA of 2015**

The United States Department of the Treasury's Federal Insurance Office (FIO), in accordance with Section 111 of the Terrorism Risk Insurance Program Reauthorization Act (TRIPRA) of 2015, has requested data from insurance carriers relating to terrorism coverage.

The WCRIBMA is working with the National Council on Compensation Insurance (NCCI) and other independent state rating bureaus to provide the workers' compensation data, related to direct business for Policy Year 2017 (PY 2017) as requested by FIO, on behalf of our collective member carriers. The WCRIBMA has agreed to submit the Massachusetts data to NCCI, who will then aggregate the Massachusetts data with the other states' data before submitting the consolidated data to FIO's data aggregator, ISO.

PY 2017 data will be summarized at the NAIC group/company level. This data will be provided to ISO for purposes of linking the workers' compensation data to the data for other lines of business. However, all identifiable group/company names and IDs will be masked by ISO prior to submission to FIO.

As a result of our collaboration with the other rating bureaus, carriers do not need to respond to FIO's data collection request as relates to directly written workers' compensation business for PY 2017. Carriers are, however, still obligated to provide FIO reinsurance information that relates to workers' compensation.
